Jr. Leader Volunteer program offers youth the opportunity to assist and gain experience working with the Municipality of The District of Shelburne's Recreation Program.

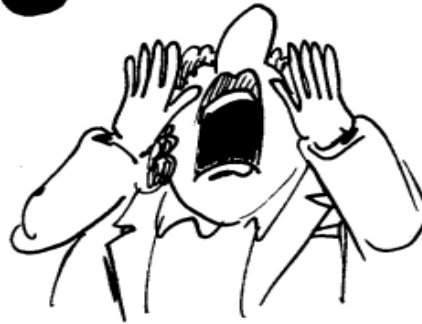
Who?

2. Apply and be accepted into the program (applicants will be interviewed)
3. Attend the Leadership Workshop
4. Emergency First Aid with CPR (\$30 fee paid by the volunteer)
5. High Five Training
6. Be willing to volunteer for a minimum of 80hours
