1. CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Warden Smith.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

3(a) **MOTION: APPROVAL OF MINUTES – December 13, 2023**

Being duly moved and seconded, be it resolved that the Minutes of December 13, 2023, be approved as circulated.

4. BUSINESS ARISING:

5. PRESENTATION

- a. Region 6 Budget 2023-24 – Christine McClare, R6
- b. Extended Producer Responsibility – Christine McClare, R6
- c. Offshore Wind Development – Kris Vascotto, Manager of NS Fisheries Alliance for Energy Engagement

5(a) Warden Smith welcomed Christine McClare. Ms. McClare gave a quick overview of the Region 6 budget for 2024/2025. Ms. McClare discussed the budget, including an overview of revenues, expenses, staffing, expected budget, funding sources, and program descriptions.

Discussion was held regarding the revenue summary and approved funds in comparison to previous years.

5(b) Ms. McClare gave a quick overview of the Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR). Ms. McClare discussed the roles, responsibilities, and milestones of the EPR program. Ms. McClare also informed Council that there would be a significant amount in savings if this project was properly implemented province-wide.

Discussion was held on the effect to the consumers. Ms. McClare stated that there would be very minor changes on the consumer end.

Warden Smith thanked Ms. McClare for presenting.

Warden Smith advised that due to the next presentation being scheduled for 7:00 pm, items on the agenda will be moved up accordingly.

6. OPERATIONS & PROTECTIVE SERVICES

- a. Speed Radar Signs – Marcia d'Eon

6(a) Marcia d'Eon, Director of Operations & Protective Services, presented Council with the Speed Radar Signs staff report.

Ms. d'Eon advised Council that staff explored options for the speed radar signs, with the cost, effectivity, and procedures in order to install the signs.

Discussion was held on this matter regarding the effectiveness of the signs, Department of Public Works requirements and staff resource availability.

MOTION: SPEED RADAR SIGNS

Be it resolved that the Council of the Municipality of Shelburne draft a letter to RCMP advising them of the specific areas where excessive speed is of concern and ask for them to erect speed signs in problem areas or to schedule speed checks in these areas, and have staff include a cost for speed radar signs in the draft 2024/2025 budget discussion.

7(a) Erin Hartley, Deputy Chief Administration Officer, presented Council with the Audit Committee – Community Member staff report.

Ms. Hartley advised Council of the vacancy on the Audit Committee and gave a brief background of the recommended member.

- a. Professional Communication Services RFP – Warren MacLeod

8(a) Warren MacLeod, Chief Administration Officer, presented Council with the Professional Communication Services RFP staff report,

Mr. MacLeod advised Council of the need for adequate communication professionals in relation to projects or emergencies.

A Request for Proposal for Professional Communication was advertised on December 5, 2023, to December 20, 2023. Mr. MacLeod advised Council that two proposals received and were scored based on several factors outlined in the RFP.

Be it resolved that the Council of the Municipality of the District of Shelburne approves awarding a standing offer contract for professional communication services to Iris Communications Inc. in response to our Request for Proposal.

9(a) Councillor Townsend advised Council of the letter received from the Shelburne Regional High School requesting funds for lunches. Discussion was held regarding the need and the importance of this program. It was suggested that all four schools be included and that staff research possible assistance and include recommendations in the 2024/2025 budget discussions.

9(b) Warden Smith introduced Pam Mingo who attended virtually via Microsoft Teams. Ms. Mingo provided an update on the First Responders Tribute project being explored and lead by SRHS. The tentative date for this event is June 1, 2024.

Following a question & answer period, Mr. Viscotto was thanked for his presentation.

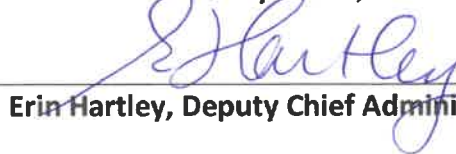
